Michael Pinsent of Grand Falls-Windsor was rewarded the Outstanding School and Community Involvement Scholarship in Memory of Owen Grimes (a previous NLCU Board Member), and Katie Brenton of Mount Pearl, was awarded the Brian F. McDonald Scholarship.
